RESIGNATION OF THE ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY

The Vicar writes: "The resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury on Tuesday and the reasons behind it have been widely covered by the media, not always accurately or fairly. I have great and continuing respect for Justin Welby and am grateful for the role he has taken in the Church as Archbishop. However, in the light of the very serious failings in the Church of England as detailed in the Makin Report into abuse committed by John Smyth, I believe resignation was the right course of action. This affair has underlined the absolute necessity of creating a Church culture, both nationally and locally, in which everyone is kept safe and I am personally so grateful to our excellent Parish Safeguarding Team, Val Edwards and Catherine Farman, and others down the years, who have worked so hard towards this end at St Oswald's. A final word should be a recognition of the appalling damage done to those subjected to Smyth's abuse and the deep distress caused to all victims of abuse every time issues of this nature are brought to light, even more so when there is a failure to provide proper support and redress."
